



NOTICE TO CONSIGNORS
As of Yearling Sales 2007 and on

The Provincial government has determined that ASHA sales must now be governed by the policies and conditions of the provincial Livestock Identification and Commerce Act (LICA). As a result, there are two key matters that consignors must consider when entering horses into sales.

1. Under the new regulations of the LICA, consignors must provide a declaration by the owner(s) or the owners' agent that discloses the name of the holder of any security interest in the livestock registered as a first charge or, if there is no security interest in the livestock, a declaration that there is no security interest.
2. Consignors must now provide or complete a manifest/bill of lading when bringing horses to the sale and upon arrival at the sales office. For any yearling sale, ASHA will make arrangements for provincial representatives to be present at the sale office to assist in completion of the documentation and inspection of the horses.
